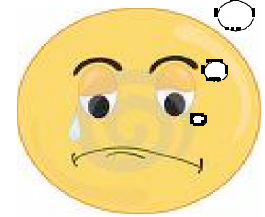


The Last Health Project

During this project you will be learning about a health topic of your choosing- something that either we have not discussed yet this year, or something that we have discussed but that you'd like to learn about in more depth. Once you have chosen your topic (very important- very difficult to learn about something when you don't know what the "something" is yet) and you've answered the two homework questions about your topic (question one: what do you want to learn about this topic and question two: what do you already know about this topic), and you've done your "rough draft," you can get started on the Keynote presentation that you will eventually save and turn in to Mrs. Anzora on her flash drive and share with the class.

What Your Project Will Contain:

- 6 slides
 - First slide/Slide 1- Title slide (minimum of your name, health class#, topic)
 - Slides 2, 3, 4- Information about your topic (remember to keep it all in your own words)
 - Slide 5- Current Event about your topic (make sure your news article has been published within the last six months)
 - Last slide/Slide 6- Bibliography- This is a list of sources where you have gotten information from, structured much like a current events citation (Author, Title, Date of Publication, Source.), organized in alphabetical order by the author's last name (any "no author given" sources are alphabetized by the first letter in the title). Things To Keep In Mind:

- Everything must be in your own words. Absolutely NO copying/cutting&pasting- NO EXCEPTIONS. Anything NOT in your own words (or even close) will be considered plagiarism, you will receive a zero for the project (but you will have to do it anyway) and you will be written up to Mr. Nolan's office (plagiarism is a Level 3 offense).
- Make sure your information is current. If your information is more than 5 years old, see if there is a more recent information source.
- No ".com" sites. You may only use information from sites that end in ".edu" and ".gov" first, then you may look at the ".org" sites for information. Check Mrs. Anzora's portaportal for links to reliable information, or check the resource wall. Be sure to write down your information as you go so you have it for your bibliography. If you have a good site to recommend, see Mrs. Anzora to put it on Resource Wall.
